Q2. Can LEAs implementing Targeted Assistance Programs apply for a waiver to the poverty requirement to become a Schoolwide Program?

A2. For 2019-2020, A LEA implementing a Targeted Assistance Program (TAP) may apply for a waiver to the poverty requirement to become a Schoolwide Program. The waiver request must be submitted to the State Department of Education (SDE) by the deadline for the 2020-2021 fiscal year. The waiver request must include a justification for the waiver and a plan for how the LEA will ensure that the program meets the requirements of the law. The waiver request must be submitted to the SDE by the deadline for the 2020-2021 fiscal year.

Q3. Will LEAs need to submit a formal waiver request to receive a waiver of the 15% carryover limit on Title I, Part A funds?

A3. No. LEAs are not required to submit a formal waiver request to receive a waiver of the 15% carryover limit on Title I, Part A funds. The 15% carryover limit is a maximum limit on the amount of funds that can be carried over from one fiscal year to the next. LEAs may request a waiver of this limit if they have a compelling reason for doing so.
